Getting to Durham

Plane

Newcastle Airport (NCL)

Newcastle Airport is approximately 20 miles north of Durham. There are connecting flights from many European hubs including London Heathrow and London Gatwick, Amsterdam, Paris and Brussels. The airport is served by a number of budget airlines.

The Metro (underground) is available from the airport to Newcastle Central Station, which takes around 20 minutes, and Metro trains run every 7 minutes. From Newcastle Central Station you can catch a train (overground) to Durham Station which takes around 15 minutes. You can find guidance on how to use the ticket machines (as well as the wider Metro system) on the Metro website.

If you are arriving in the evening or departing in the morning, we recommend taking a taxi from the airport to avoid the risk of missing the last trains south (see taxi section).

Durham Tees Valley Airport (DTV)

Durham Tees Valley is approximately 25 miles south of Durham. Although it has fewer flights than Newcastle, there are connecting flights with Amsterdam and other cities, and it is served by budget airlines.

Train

Durham Station

Over 60 trains call at Durham daily from most major centres in the country, including 14 trains from London.

The high speed LNER service takes under 3 hours from London Kings Cross on the main East Coast line. First Transpennine Express offers frequent links from North West England, Yorkshire and Scotland. Cross Country trains link Durham with Yorkshire, Manchester, Nottingham, Bristol, Cardiff, Southampton and Edinburgh.

A taxi from Durham Station to the majority of the University venues in Durham would cost in the region of £5.00 to £8.00. There is a taxi rank at the station. You will also find a list of Durham taxis in our taxi section.

Car

Durham is only 2 miles from the A1(M) motorway. Leave the motorway at Junction 62 on the A690 heading towards Durham. Follow the signs to the city centre.

The city is served by three Park & Ride sites on the key routes into the city. These are situated at Belmont, Sniperley and Howlands. The Howlands site is approximately a 17 minute walk from the conference venue. These sites are open 7am to 7pm daily. A direct bus service runs from each site to the city centre. The sites offer free parking for users of the Park & Ride service and unlimited daily travel into the city centre and back for around £2.00.

Park & Ride users can also use the bus to the Cathedral for free.

County Durham has to offer in your spare time! From breathtaking landscapes to local festivals, there's plenty going on which doesn't cost anything.

We have compiled a list of some of the things to discover around Durham:

Durham University

Durham University is home to internationally important collections from across history and around the globe. We welcome visitors to our museums and galleries and garden. Located in two clusters, at the heart of the UNESCO World Heritage Site and to the south of the city, our venues are open year-round and are open to all. County Durham

With places for a relaxing stroll or cycle, brushing up on your history, and days out with the kids, many of the attractions are within walking distance of the centre of Durham or accessible by public transport from the city.

- Seaham: On Durham's coast, there's lots to do in Seaham over the summer.
 The historic <u>Seaham Harbour Marina</u> is the only one in County Durham
 and boasts several local businesses including cafes. Seaham Beach is also a
 great spot for a day out.
- Durham's stunning coastline: Stretching all the way from Sunderland to Hartlepool, running through Seaham, the **Durham Heritage Coast** is a dramatic landscape of beaches, rugged cliffs and imposing headlands.
- <u>Durham Cathedral</u>: Entry is free (with a donation suggested) and you can explore the almost 1,000-year-old building and discover its hidden histories.
- Penshaw Monument and Herrington Country Park: One of the landmarks of the North East, the 21m-tall <u>Penshaw Monument</u> is a replica of an Ancient Greek temple and visible from 50 miles away. Standing on top of a hill, it has panoramic views across County Durham and Wearside.

Getting about Durham

Walking

Durham's compact city centre and university campus are highly walkable, offering both convenience and picturesque views. The city is famously hilly, with lots of cobbles, so please do bear this in mind.

City Centre to Durham University: The route from the city centre to the conference venue on the Durham University Science Site is approximately a 15-minute walk.

Bus

Durham's bus network is reliable and well-connected, ensuring comfortable travel throughout the city and surrounding area. **Arriva Bus Services** operates the majority of routes in Durham, with many buses equipped with low floors for easy access.

Key buses connecting the city centre with Durham University Science Site (the conference venue) include the **56**, **58**, **X12** and the **6**. These run approximately every 10-15 minutes during peak times.

Taxi

The venue

The Palatine Centre

Stockton Rd, Durham DH1 3LE

Situated on Stockton Road within Durham University's Lower Mountjoy site, the Palatine Centre offers modern facilities designed with inclusivity in mind:

- Step-Free Access: The building offers step-free access throughout, ensuring ease of movement for wheelchair users and those with mobility impairments.
- All-gender and Accessible Toilets and Changing Facilities: Accessible and allgender toilet facilities are available on the ground floor. A Changing Places toilet is located on the ground floor, equipped with an adjustable changing bench and a powered overhead hoist.

- Hearing Assistance: A fixed hearing loop system is installed at the reception desk to assist attendees with hearing impairments.
- Lift Access: Standard lifts provide access to all floors, featuring tactile markings and audible floor indicators to assist visually impaired users.
- All seminar rooms and lecture theatres have dimmable lights, with considerations for acoustics and space to ensure comfortable movement for all participants.
- Access to green space (e.g., woodland and river walks) within close proximity.

In addition to the lecture theatres and seminar rooms where the conference papers will be presented, we will be offering the following dedicated rooms within the venue as part of our commitment to meet the access and inclusion needs of as many potential attendees, whether in person or online, as we possibly can.

Networking Room

A space with room for movement and ample seating designed to foster connection and conversation, with optional prompts provided by our Creative Facilitation Unit to support accessible social engagement.

Sensory Room

Dark/Quiet Room

Virtual Attendance Rooms for Keynotes

Designated spaces within the venue where attendees can attend the hybrid keynote sessions in a separate setting, offering greater flexibility and comfort while staying connected to the main event. Attendees will still be able to participate in the question-and-answer sessions virtually.
